• Gurdwara amendment bill 2016

- Under Sikh Gurdwaras Act, 1925, every Sikh who is above 21 years of age can cast their vote in the Sikh Gurdwara Prabandhak Committee (SPGC) Election.
- Act had created an exception for Sehjdhari Sikhs who trim or shave their beard or hair to vote in the elections.

#### Biotech centre bill passed

- Lok Sabha passed the Regional Centre for Biotechnology Bill, 2016
- To establish a Regional Centre for Biotechnology, a study center of Education, Training and Research under the sponsorship of United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

Panic Button and Global Positioning System in Mobile phone handsets from 2017

- Aim:
  - Providing security to millions of women who face panic situation
  - Panic button **will act as restrictions to assaulters**

#### **Operation Sulaimani to eradicate Poverty in Kozhikode District**

- Aim is to eradicate poverty and to avoid food wastage in the district.
- Will provide food to around 1,000 people per day.
- Price of the food will be covered through sponsorship.
- People in need can collect a free meal coupon from any of the distribution centers and walk into any restaurant in the city.
- Hungry people will be served food for free without asking any questions.
- Coupons will be distributed through the counters to be opened in the collectorate, village office and Taluk offices.

#### Haryana govt to give free laptops to first 500 meritorious students

- The laptops will be provided under **State Merit Scholarship scheme**.
- Free laptops to **500 meritorious students who secure a minimum of 95 per cent marks in Class X** Board examination this year.

#### Rs 1 lakh per month to Rio-bound athletes

- Rs. One lakh per month as Out of Pocket allowance to the sports persons under the Target Olympic Podium (TOP) scheme.
- an initiative of Union Sports Ministry under which sports persons are funded by the government for top class training as part of their preparations for the Games.
- **77** Indian athletes in eight disciplines have qualified for the Olympics and many more are likely to qualify in the next two months.

#### Generics prescription law Cure for high medicines bill

- Central government is considering the introduction of a law to make it mandatory for doctors to prescribe generic drugs
- So that patients can access affordable medicines provided through state-run Jan Aushadhi stores.
- **Doctors usually don't prescribe generic medicines supplied through Jan Aushadi stores.** So patients find it tough to ask for the correct generic equivalents.

#### Centre steps in to expedite patent approvals

- Government is taking measures to reduce the time to examine patent applications for clearing them at the earliest.
- Time is between **5 and 7 years for the first examination of patent applications**.
- **Target is to bring it down to 18 months,** which is the benchmark in the U.S. for the first examination after the applications are filed.
- To bring down the examination time, government will be setting a monthly, quarterly, halfyearly and an annual benchmark.

#### NIMZ in Medak

- Final approval to the National Investment and Manufacturing Zone (NIMZ) at Zaheerabad in Medak district, Telangana.
- Estimated **total investment by the manufacturing industry** by the end of the ultimate phase of the NIMZ's development is **Rs.17, 300 crore**
- Employment generation is about 2.77 lakh.

Government considering axing 52 out of 200 allowances

- Seventh Pay Commission found inadequate the justifications offered by the Ministries for these allowances.
- Commission suggested that another **36 be subsumed in an existing allowance or in new allowances it proposed.**



INS Karmuk engaged in Indo-Thai Coordinated Patrol

- 22nd Indo-Thai Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT), scheduled from 19-27 April 2016 in the Andaman Sea.
- Two navies have been carrying out CORPATs along the International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL) twice a year since 2005.
- Strengthened understanding and interoperability between the navies and facilitated institution of measures to prevent unlawful activities at sea as well as conduct Search and Rescue (SAR) operations.

### Business and Economy 8.7% interest on EPF for 2015-16

- 8.7% interest on PF deposits for over 5 crore subscribers of retirement body Employment Provident Fund Organization (EPFO),
- Lower than 8.8% decided by Central Board of Trustees (CBT).

Rs 694 crore LPG project in West Bengal

- To boost supply and help achieve the government's target of making LPG available to each household by 2018.
- Bharat Petroleum Corporation (BPCL) will set up an import terminal at Haldia to import 1 mmtpa of refrigerated Propane and Butane
- Will transfer it through **7.5-km long twin transfer pipeline for LPG production**, dispatch of bulk LPG via road tankers and bottling of LPG in cylinders

Cadbury inaugurates largest Asia-Pacific facility in India

- Company's largest plant in the Asia-Pacific region
- Plant's capacity is 250,000 tonnes a year, which the company hopes to touch by 2020.

- Now customers can recharge their d2h service using Vodafone m-pesa.
- Tie-up will serve both Videocon d2h and Vodafone subscribers by providing a safe, secure and convenient mode to pay for services to customers

Nokia plans to acquire Withings for \$191 million

- Planning to buy France's Withings S.A. for 170 million euros (\$191 million) in its bid to expand into digital health markets.
- Withings' products include activity trackers, weighing scales, thermometers, blood pressure monitors, home and baby monitors.

JKLF founder Amanullah Khan dead at 82

- Founder of Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF), Amanullah Khan died in Pakistan. He was 82.
- Considered to be the architect of Kashmir's armed insurgency
- Founder of the Jammu Kashmir Liberation Front that led a violent campaign for independent Kashmir
- Listed among the most wanted fugitives in India by the Central Bureau of Investigation for "murder and criminal conspiracy"

Science and Technology NMA'S online web portal 'NOAPS' to facilitate single window clearance

- Portal has used the **technology and expertise of Indian Space Research Organization** (ISRO).
- Web portal of NMA has now been integrated with the online portal of local bodies of Delhi and Mumbai viz. NDMC, Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai (MCGM) and MCDs (South MCD, North MCD, East MCD)
- To facilitate single window clearance for construction on a common application form.
