- an intense rural patrolling system, **RRPRS Rapid Rural Police Response System**, in order to ensure the safety of the rural areas of Punjab, which comprises of around 12,000 villages.
- all the rural people can call "100" in case of distress and the police will response within a short span of not more than 20 minutes.
- 24 X 7 facility with dedicated control rooms and dedicated twin lines to reduce channel traffic.

- renaming MHOW Railway Station After B R Ambedhkar. He was born at Mhow, Madhya pradesh in 1891.
- Mhow was renamed as Dr Ambedkar Nagar in 2003 by the Madhya Pradesh government.

An official internet speed check app by TRAI

- TRAI's MySpeed App is free and measures the download and upload speed of your internet connection, for both **Wi-Fi and Cellular connectivity**
- also gives real time data from customers and show the mobile data speed of each operator in a given area on real time basis.
- app also allows users to send their **speed test, signal strength, network information results** to the regulatory body.

BRICS Working Group meeting on "Energy Saving and Energy Efficiency"

- maiden meeting of BRICS Working Group meeting on "Energy Saving and Energy Efficiency" held in Vishakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh on 4th and 5th July.
- meet rechecked the vitality and necessity of the advancing cooperation between the member countries in the field of energy efficiency and energy developing technologies.
- meeting acknowledged the role of the energy saving and energy efficiency in ensuring sustainable economic development of the member countries.
- energy efficiency concludes with the following important ideas:
 - o To Implement the areas of cooperation between the BRICS countries as identified in the Memorandum of Understanding on energy saving and energy efficiency.
 - o To Prepare recommendations for the development of cooperation in the area of energy saving and improvement of energy efficiency for the BRICS Ministers of Energy.
 - To Elaborate the work plan on development of cooperation in energy saving and energy efficiency within BRICS (Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa) till 2020 and beyond.
 - measure of the commitment to this cause, each BRICS Member country decided to appoint a focal point for interaction and coordination with other BRICS countries and to support the Working Group in deepening this cooperation.

approval of MoU between India and Mauritius in the field of rural development and poverty alleviation

- Memorandum of Understanding between India and Mauritius in the field of Rural development and Poverty Alleviation on 5th July 2016.
- Both the countries have a large segment of their population living in rural areas and are predominantly dependent on agriculture and its allied activities for their livelihoods.
- MoU will help to constitute a integral framework for cooperation between the National Development Unit, Prime Minister's Office of the Republic of Mauritius and the Ministry of Rural Development of the Republic of India.
- a Joint Committee on Cooperation on Rural Development will be established which will meet alternatively in both countries on mutually agreed dates.
- Key objectives:
 - Exchange of relevant information and documents in the sphere of rural development, including scientific and technical information together with policies and support measures adopted to foster rural development
 - Cooperation by exchanging relevant information on issues of mutual interest
 - o **exchange visits** on programs to foster sharing of experience
 - Collaboration to strengthen their human resource capacity through sector-specific incountry training in Mauritius and training at reputed institutions in India.
 - To facilitate the transfer of latest technology, state of the art equipment and materials, and share best practices.

- A veteran communist leader and Former president of World Peace Council
- Mr. Romesh Chandra was born at Lyallpur (Punjab) in 1919.
- He joined Communist Party of India (CPI) in 1939 and participated in Indian Freedom Struggle as a Student leader.
- was also the **editor of "new age"**, the central organ of CPI.
- joined World Peace Council (WPC) headquarters in Helsinki in 1953 and became its president in 1977.
- was a recipient of Lenin Peace Award and also holds the record of addressing the United
 Nations Assembly many a times, the highest number of times by an Indian.

Science and Technology

rarefied ant mimicking spider species found in Kerala

- new species of ANT-MIMICKING SPIDER was found in the WAYANAD Wildlife Sanctuary of KERALA.
- peculiar mimicking spider has been jointly discovered by researchers of the Centre for Animal Taxonomy and Ecology (CATE) of Christ College, Irinjalakuda, and the Oxford Museum of Natural History, London.
- this unique spider belongs to the Aetius genus of the ant-mimicking spider family Corinidae.
- spider exactly resembles the ant by raising its front legs during its movement as like ants.
- spider also utilizes this legs (antennae) to escape from its predators.
